



## RAROTONGA ARTS AND CRAFTS

### Private Arts and Crafts Tour

This fascinating 4 hour tour allows you the opportunity to visit many of the local factories, & souvenir stores around Rarotonga and a chance to meet a number of our local artists who are very passionate about their culture & history.

With your tour guide you will be inspired as you learn about the values of our Arts & Crafts visiting each of these sites, and what better way to do this than from the comfort of an air-conditioned private car. Your tour starts as soon as you are picked from your accommodation and depending on which village you're staying in, this will determine your first stop.

You will visit the Koteka Winery where you will sample their locally brewed exotic flavoured liqueurs and spirits. Following this you will learn about the production of the local beer of the Cook Islands at the Matutu Brewery.

The Rito factory is another stop, this is a small family run business that specialises in producing beauty and health products made with cold pressed virgin coconut oil.

Meet with Natua at his ukulele workshop and learn how the local instrument is created, you will also enjoy learning the art of pareu making, and also learn how to make a flower ei.

Visit Madam Anne at her store, a woman who specializes in Tivaevae collections, a type of artistic quilting, learned and further developed from the time of the English missionaries.

Stop at Perfumes of Rarotonga, for locally made souvenirs, perfumes and scented natural soaps.

You will visit The Beachcomber—an old building of colonial architecture which now houses a number of boutique stores including a contemporary art gallery, a pearl store, a mini café and TAVs local fashion store specializing in Pacific Designer apparel. Kay George who is a local artist well-known for her unique style in producing beautifully hand-painted fabrics, paintings and photographs also has some of her artwork on display here.

Learn about the art of pearl carving with Tokerau Jim, one of the top black pearls carvers in the world.

Then to complete a great tour you will enjoy a scrumptious lunch at the Mooring Fish Café.
